#### **Something to Ponder On.**

The Responsorial Psalm today is **that of the beautiful shepherd** – **psalm**. I love the image of the restful waters in the land of the bible, sheep pastured on the rocky mountainsides, allowing the fertile lowlands for crops and vines. In contrast to other animals, sheep need very little water. Apparently, they cannot drink from the swiftly flowing water of the mountain streams, so the shepherd has to find a still pool or create one with a dam of stones.

**The flowing water** is an *image of our busy time*. Although God is everywhere, we find it hard to drink of the divine presence, <u>if the pace is hectic</u>. We need the pool of still time, the quiet corner, the period of solitude. It is there that our, <u>drooping spirit is revived</u>. Unless we regularly come apart, we run the risk of being torn apart.

Little things can mean a lot, *like having a meal with others instead of a snack alone*. Sitting at a table instead of standing at a counter, using a teapot instead of teabag-in-cup, placing a saucer under a cup.

What the world needs most of all are people of vision, contemplatives and people of true holiness to restore the big picture of life. They were like sheep without a shepherd, so he set himself to teach them at some length.

Prayer: **Be still and know that I am God**. Give yourself the gift of time and space, *where you listen to God*. Gaze at the face of Jesus as he looks at us with compassion. All yourself to be loved by God.
